

Each petition ends with "Hear us, O God". The assembly responds with "your mercy is great."


SHARING OF THE PEACE - The presiding and the assembly share a virtual sign of peace. The peace of Christ be with you always. **And also with you.**

hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come,


